We had a fantastic day of supramolecular chemistry with more than 100 participants, 36 posters, 15 talks (equal gender representation), and 1 plenary lecture by Prof. Tony Davis. Comments	Lancaster University hosted MASC2018 on the 17th and 18th of December 2018 (http://wp.lancs.ac.uk/masc/programme/). The event was attended by ~150 people with 7 countries represented. There was a packed programme of lectures with a number given by PhD students and younger researchers, as is the tradition of the meeting, with a balance of male and female speakers (approx. 2:1). There were over 80 poster presentations, with five poster and a best flash presentation prize being awarded thanks to the generous support of Wiley and RSC Books. Poster prize winners were: There were 5 plenary speakers, 4 invited speakers, 5 contributed talks and 7 flash talks. The MASC PhD award lecture was given by Liang Zhang (Manchester). The Bob Hay award went to Professor Rachel O'Reilly (Birmingham). Sijbren Otto delivered his RSC Supramolecular Chemistry Prize Lecture and received his medal. The cost of the meeting was met through a combination of generous commercial sponsorship (there were 11 exhibitors/sponsors) and registration fees. This money was used to offer a reduced registration price for student participants who received an £80 discount (approximately half price) compared to non-student participants. Poster prizes were provided by RSC Publishing (Chem. Soc. Rev., OBC, Chem. Sci), the MASC Interest Group and Chem (Cell Press).
